State of Hospitality & Tourism Explores Industry Trends



On Thursday, CFHLA partnered with <u>CareerSource Central Florida</u> and <u>STR</u> to host our second annual State of Hospitality & Tourism at the <u>Caribe Royale Orlando</u> (Thank you, Amaury Piedra, Managing Director).

With more than 350 in attendance, this regional economic forum brought together industry and community leaders, elected officials and news media for an in-depth analysis of the current economic impact, market and workforce trends (including recently updated wages, benefits, demographics, etc.), and share local forecasts for the Central Florida hospitality and tourism industry.

The event featured presentations by **Nilda Blanco**, Senior Vice President of Strategic Initiatives with CareerSource Central Florida, and **Isaac Collazo**, Vice President of Analytics with STR.

Here are the top five key takeaways:

- As the largest employer in our region, nearly 80% of all Central
 Florida's occupations are now tied to the leisure and tourism
 industry. This is a significant opportunity to challenge how we look at
 careers in the industry and highlight different career paths and nontraditional roles.
- Contrary to some perceptions, 90% of job postings are for full-time roles within the industry, which has created numerous opportunities for long-term career paths.
- The industry's wages are very competitive and a launchpad for career advancement. The average entry level wage within the Central Florida hotel and lodging industry is \$39,000, which is well above the average Central Florida entry level wage of \$31,000.

- Many positions come with competitive wages, benefits and clear pathways for professional development.
- Data shows the market is strong in Central Florida but still recovering from the peak level of visitors staying at our properties in 2019.
- There is cautious optimism that 2025 will have stronger demand and growth than 2024, with the opening of new attractions, accomodations, etc.

CFHLA Foundation Awards \$25,000 in Grants to Support Students' Career Development

At Thursday's annual State of Hospitality & Tourism, the <u>CFHLA Foundation</u> was proud to distribute \$25,000 in grants to three local organizations who are empowering students to develop their careers.

The CFHLA Foundation awarded a \$5,000 grant to <u>CareerSource Central</u> <u>Florida</u> to support its 2025 CareerSource Central Florida Summer Youth Program, so 1,500 Central Florida High School students can explore career opportunities. The CFHLA Foundation also granted \$15,000 to <u>UCF Rosen</u> <u>College of Hospitality Management</u> to help fund its two annual career fairs and create the P.O.M.P. Fund by CFHLA, which provides early support and mentorship to all first semester college students and it has resulted in success.

Lastly, the CFHLA Foundation gave a \$5,000 grant to support <u>Seminole</u> <u>State College</u>'s Hospitality and Tourism Management Program. The donation will help operate the program's food trailer, an innovative classroom on wheels for culinary students.


The Inn at Celebration, Autograph Collection Hosts Grand Opening
